Wentworth candidates the republic

The Real Republic Australia says half of the 16 candidates standing in the Wentworth by-election support an Australian republic and three of those back a direct election model for head of state.

Chair of the Real Republic Australia, David Muir, said all 16 candidates were asked to state where they stood on the republic issue by answering two simple questions:

- do you support Australia becoming a republic?
- do you support a republic model with a head of state directly elected by Australian voters?

Mr Muir said the Real Republic Australia supported a republic with a directly head of state and that model was supported by three candidates:

- Deb Doyle, Animal Justice Party
- Licia Heath, Independent, and
- Shayne Higson, Voluntary Euthanasia Party.

Five other candidates supported a republic but not a directly elected head of state:

- Kay Dunne, Sustainable Australia
- Steven Georgantis, Australian People's Party
- Dominic Wy Kanak, The Greens
- Barry Keldoulis, The Arts Party, and
- Andrea Leong, Science Party.

"It's disappointing that responses were not received from all candidates. Voters deserve to know where their would-be MP stands on this important issue for our nation's future especially since they are seeking to replace someone who supported Australia becoming a republic," Mr Muir said.

"Sadly, Malcolm Turnbull as Prime Minister failed to show true national leadership so we hope the next Member for Wentworth will be a stronger and more active advocate of a republic with an elected head of state."

In addition to a directly elected head of state the Real Republic Australia supports a package of Constitutional reforms including recognition of indigenous Australians, recognition of local government, and parliamentary reforms to deliver greater stability through cutting Senate numbers and implementing synchronised, fixed, four-year terms for both Houses of Parliament.

"These reforms that would mean cost savings and more stable government," Mr Muir said.
